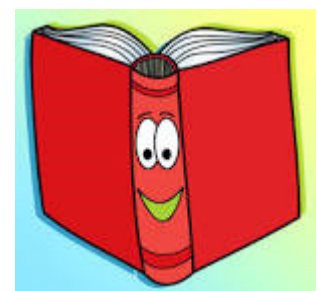
### Young Enterprise:

## Information:

Our tracking and monitoring periods are in place and you will have received an early intervention letter if faculties feel that pupils have not made the required progress in order to realise their potential. These letters contain an acknowledgement slip and we ask that you make every effort to have them returned to the school office. The school is keeping a close eye on both progress and attendance as they are key to raising attainment. Attendance figures are improved from the same period last year but we have yet to reach the Aberdeenshire average figure. We will continue to strive to achieve this.

The vast majority of pupils are proud to wear their uniform and members of the public have written to comment on their smartness when they see them around town at lunchtime. We have a few, however, that are wearing shirts without a tie and pupils wearing leggings or denims have also been noted. I ask that you please ensure that your child is coming to school in the appropriate uniform. The details can be accessed on the school website.

Pupils also need to carry their diaries and their National Entitlement cards daily. Although much of their homework is recorded through Show My Homework, they still need their diaries for target setting, profiling and for noting assessments. Forgetting National Entitlement Cards causes problems for librarians and catering staff as it creates unnecessary queues. Please help your child to be prepared for school and check that they have all the necessary equipment with them to ensure a smooth journey through their day. 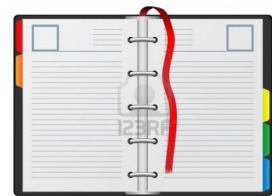


