Achievements/Events:

It is a UK wide charity that links schools and colleges with employers, helping to prepare young people for the world of work. Pupils are provided with a mentor and are given a work placement during the summer term.

We had great success last year with Calum Christie winning an award for best student.

Active Schools:



Our Active Schools Coordinator had a busy year last session and she plans to continue to build on successes and work with our PE staff as well as Community Learning and Development. Pupils will be working towards their Sports Leader award and others will be taking part in Y-Dance. Active Schools also arrange for sports men and women to attend the school to inspire youngsters and encourage them to make healthy choices.

Swimming:

Caitlin Davies, Briony Rollo and Mark Campbell had great success in November's ND Grand Prix in Inverness. They achieved an array of personal bests and Mark came home with a silver for the 50 m breast stroke and Caitlin achieving a third place in the finals of the freestyle event.

Caitlin then attended the Scottish National Short Course 2015 in Edinburgh where she was chosen to represent the City of Aberdeen Swim Team. The team won the 200m Free relay claiming a new Scottish Junior Record.

The work and dedication to reach top level swimming is immense and so a huge well done to Caitlin, Briony and Mark this term.



Charity Committee:

Sadly, one of our S6 pupils, Emma Sim, passed away after a lengthy illness. Staff and pupils were devastated by the news and their hearts went out to Emma's friends and family. The Charity Prefect Committee decided to raise money in aid of the Brain Tumour Charity. They held a quiz night which made over £1500 and had a day where pupils could wear Emma's favourite colours of blue or green. Pupils continued to donate and a staggering £3310.15 has been raised. Well done to all who helped to organise for this worthy cause.

We also raised funds for Save the Children on Friday 18th December by taking part in Wear a Christmas Jumper Day. An impressive £510.55 was made.




Thorpe Molloy Art Competition:

Children's University:



From next term, the academy and a number of our cluster primary schools will be participating in Children's University. This is a scheme that recognises pupils' efforts and achievements in learning activities done outwith school time. Pupils record, in a special Passport to Learning, the learning time they do at a range of activities, for example school clubs, local organisations and places of interest.

Every time pupils take part in a learning experience at a validated learning destination, they earn credits leading to a graduation ceremony at Aberdeen University in June 2016. It is **not** about preparing young people for university; it is about giving all children, no matter their academic ability, the chance to develop skills and broaden their horizons. Farewell to Mr Strachan :

Mr Strachan was not only a pupil of Peterhead Academy but has been a loyal and much respected member of staff for the past 41 years and 2 months. After such service, he well deserves a long and happy retirement. Mr Strachan started his teaching career in the Maths department in 1974 and then into History shortly after. In 1980, he became Principal Teacher of Guidance where he has supported pupils in the most dedicated fashion ever since.

He has some fantastic memories including ski trips to Italy, Switzerland and St Moritz, heading up the Prefects' Charity through the 80s and 90s, being taken on a helicopter flight over the North East, seeing one of our pupils, Lawrie Philips win the Scottish Schools' Golf Championship, managing the legendary First Eleven football team 2003-4, an epic yacht trip to Stonehaven, the Belgian football trip, Rock Challenge trips to York and Grimsby and Activities trips to Edinburgh, Old Trafford and Alton Towers. As you can see, Mr Strachan's commitment to the school has been so much more than simply being in the classroom.

He says he has worked with the finest of colleagues and has loved being part of the lives of the best pupils anywhere. We wish him all the very best in his retirement. He will be sorely missed.


