As we enter the second half of this session, I trust this finds you well and you find the contents of this newsletter informative and encouraging.

INAUGURAL S1 CEILIDH: In the spirit of Curriculum for Excellence, on the afternoon of Friday 24th January, our first ever S1 Ceilidh took place in the Games Hall. The ceilidh was the culmination of cross curricular work by the English, Drama and PE Faculties, of a Scottish theme including Burns Poetry, the Tam O'Shanter Play and Scottish Country Dancing. The pupils wore a "touch of tartan" for the event, which was led by our School Ceilidh band and enjoyed by all.

LEARNING VISIT: On Thursday 6th February and Friday 7th February, as part of Aberdeenshire's EL&L strategic planning for all schools, we will be undergoing a "Learning Visit" led by several members of EL&L staff. The aim of the visit is to support us, as a school, along our "Journey to Excellence" in confirming three questions for us: How are we doing? How do we know? and Where do we go now? I welcome this visit and support from Aberdeenshire and look forward to having our areas of good practice and development confirmed.



AFTER SCHOOL REVISION SESSIONS: As intimated in my previous newsletter we will again be offering a range of after school study classes for S4 to S6 pupils. These will begin following the February mid-term break through to the Easter Holidays and you will receive information about these sessions following completion of the current prelim exams. There is clear evidence that the pupils who attended last session's classes performed better than those who didn't and I ask for your assistance in encouraging your child to attend.

DENIM FOR DYLAN: On Thursday 13th February, as a school we will be supporting "Denim for Dylan" to raise funds for this deserving local cause. Pupils will be allowed to wear blue denim

to school for a small donation and do their part in helping “Turn the Blue Toon Blue” for Dylan. This is instead of the normal dress down day at the end of term and as a result Friday 4th April will now be a normal school uniform day.



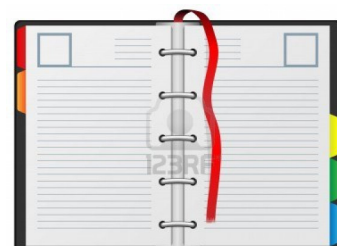

The reasons being, if the pupil is outside/poolside/helping out with classes it is hygienic to have a spare set of kit other than school clothes to wear (in case they get wet/perspire).
