- The minutes of the meeting dated 13th September 2022 were approved by the PTA.



We are currently live on the Asda Green Token Scheme online - can we please post on the schools' social media and ask for parents/carers to vote for Peterhead Academy online.






UPDATE ON NEW CAMPUS

A statement from John Macleod - Property and Facilities Manager, Aberdeenshire Council

Following the previous update in June, the Peterhead Community Campus project team would like to provide a further update on project progress, status, and forthcoming activities. Since the previous update, the design team have concluded the initial concept design phase for the education campus on Kinmundy Road, with further development of the design ongoing, through to the end of the year. Design work to date has involved engagement with strategic and operational level stakeholders, to both inform and verify the developing design solutions. Floor plans are now at an advanced stage of development, with other design workstreams, including foundation solutions, heating and ventilation strategies, and wall and roof designs also being developed. Project workstreams are generally progressing in line with programme, and we still anticipate construction of the education campus at Kinmundy to complete in March 2026.

As stakeholders will likely be aware, construction costs across the country have increased significantly since the project budget was set in April 2021, and we are currently quantifying the impact of this on the project, along with any potential requirement for additional funding. While we had anticipated sharing concept design proposals with the wider stakeholder groups at this stage, due to the aforementioned cost increases, we are required to bring the proposals and revised cost estimates back to Council, before sharing with stakeholders and the wider community.


Despite the budget challenges, the Council remain committed to delivering this exciting project and the project team are delighted to be able to report the positive progress identified above, and we look forward to engaging with stakeholders, and sharing the developing design solutions early in 2023.



HEAD TEACHERS REPORT

- DYW Partnerships (designed to develop our community's workforce of the future through an enhanced skills driven curriculum in the CfE. Strategic PT post has been advertised to develop this, and there is strong interest from candidates out with Peterhead Academy.
- Influencing Partners (Score & Symposium)
- Collaborating Partners (Scottish Seafood Association, Stella's Voice)
- Planning stages (Palace Hotel, Barclays)
- Art department partnered with Peterhead Hospital to showcase pupil artwork.
- School of Football is progressing well and has shown positive impact on the young people involved (meeting school expectations).
- School of Dance planned for later this term.
- School of Science and Engineering is well through the planning process and will our first curricular focussed self-sustaining school of excellence (launches in May 23).
- Most recent TES Pulse Survey showed improvement in staff wellbeing.
- School is working toward a STEM Nation award programme through collaborative working across the science, technology and maths faculties. This programme celebrates, promotes and builds effective practice in STEM education within and across sectors (<https://blogs.glowscotland.org.uk/glowblogs/stemnation/stem-nation-award-for-elc-settings-and-schools/>). Only one High school in Scotland been awarded it, we'd be the first in the north of Scotland to achieve it.
- We plan to offer a senior ball for the S5 & S6 pupils this session. A committee has been formed and planning is underway.
- YPI Final is taking place on 15th Dec 0830 to 12noon, we would like a rep from the PTC to attend if possible?

How many of the SQA non-priority appeals were successful?


- Eighty-five non-priority appeals have been sent away with 19/85 (22%) being successful. No one was downgraded. 20% was about average for schools from what we have been able to find out from neighbouring schools.

How is the preparation for prelims going?



INITIAL LOCAL AUTHORITY IMPROVEMENT VISIT


